We have an extraordinary trip planned for tenth grade. This will be a wonderful opportunity to see and explore one of the most incredible places in Texas – THE BIG BEND! We will set up camp at Big Bend Resort Campground located in Study Butte, TX, between Big Bend National Park and Big Bend State Park. Students will live in tents, sleep in sleeping bags and utilize other outdoor gear supplied by Faith Family Academy. Our trip will include hiking in both parks and learning paddling skills on the Rio Grande. Both the canoe trip and hiking in Big Bend National Park will be guided by Far Flung Outdoor Center with trained guides. The hike in Big Bend State Park will be led by Faith Family Academy staff trained to lead the hike.

- Bus transportation to/from Big Bend
- All meals
- Guided hikes in Big Bend National Park and Big Bend State Park
- One full day canoeing on the Rio Grande
- All park entrance and camping fees
- o Equipment backpacks, sleeping bags, tents, sleeping pads, water bottles, etc.


Trip #1 (Girls):

OUTDOOR EDUCATION PHILOSOPHY

Faith Family Academy is introducing a variety of outdoor programs for its students. The focus is to teach safe and comfortable living in the wilderness while learning an appreciation of its beauty, a respect for the interrelationship of its parts, and an understanding of the need for continued protection and preservation of the wilderness environment. Students will experience the out-of-doors with the attitude of "learning by doing."

By participating, students broaden their personal awareness and experience through the process of adjusting to an unfamiliar outdoor setting. Students learn to separate their needs from wants and learn to live without the aid of modern America. Out of necessity, they evaluate their relations with others, discover the need for group support, and develop leadership capabilities --- often previously inexperienced.

The intent for this program is that students graduate from Faith Family Academy with the ability to travel through the back country with a measure of confidence, a minimum of environmental impact, a maximum of observational skills, and the wish to continue outdoor exploration. It is desired that students learn skills and discover their physical capabilities, make decisions and stretch their talents, but above all, experience the fun and joy of the outdoor world.

Outdoor Education Goals

- 1. To enable students to **know themselves** and their abilities.
- 2. To improve **thinking skills** through the necessity of solving problems with a real or imaginary physical impediment.
- 3. To develop and improve leadership and communication skills necessary to be successful in life.
- 4. To allow students the realization that they are capable of greater stamina, emotionally, physically, and mentally, than had previously been thought by placing them in a physically difficult, unfamiliar environment.
- 5. To develop in students a **love and respect for the natural world** so that, as adults, they may become discerning decision makers regarding environmental issues.
- 6. To enlist the active participation of each student by engaging his hands and his imagination in a **direct learning process**.
- 7. To provide an emotional, physical, and mental challenge and lead students to growth.
- 8. To correspond the Outdoor Education goals with those of the science and history curricula of the appropriate grade; to provide a better understanding of subject content and the opportunity to apply knowledge gained in the classroom.
- 9. To familiarize students with **outdoor living/travel procedures and safety**.

EXPLORE360™ – BIG BEND AREA PARKS TRIP ITINERARY

Trip Details

May 3, 2021 ALL PERMISSION AND MEDICAL HISTORY FORMS ARE DUE!

Girls – November 6-10, 2021 Boys – November 11-15, 2021

- Depart from the Oak Cliff campus for Big Bend at **6:00 a.m.** by bus. We will be loading the bus at the school entrance behind McDonalds. After stopping for lunch at Cici's pizza in Midland, the bus should arrive around **4:00 p.m.** Students will set up tents and get familiar with their new surroundings.
- Day 2 Students will begin their Big Bend adventure in Big Bend National Park. A moderate hike up Lost Mine Trail in the Chisos Mountains will allow students to see a part of Texas few ever see. After lunch on the trail, students will spend time studying the flora and fauna of the area on a self-guided nature trail. They will end their National Park visit with a 30-minute video about the history of the park.
- Day 3 Students will spend day two of their adventure in Big Bend State Park. At more than 300,000 acres, this is the largest State Park in Texas. We will spend the day hiking the Closed Canyon Trail and the Hoodoos Trail.
- Day 4 Students will spend the day canoeing on the Rio Grande under the guidance of Far Flung Outdoor Center. Far Flung will provide canoes, paddles, life jackets and guides to teach students the basics of canoeing.
- Day 5 Students will have a quick breakfast, then break down their tents and pack up for the trip home. The bus will depart at 10:00 a.m. with a stop again in Midland for pizza. The bus should arrive back at the Oak Cliff campus at approximately 8:00 p.m.

Weather Preparation

November at Big Bend typically features average temperatures in the high 70s during the day and low 50s at night. While rare, temperatures at night can drop into the 30s, so students should be prepared.

EXPLORE360™ ADVENTURE LEARNING EQUIPMENT CHECKLIST

We cannot emphasize enough the importance of adequate clothing. Although we do not anticipate extreme temperatures, all students and adult leaders must be prepared for inclement weather. Cold temperatures, rain and wind does little harm to a group with a well-planned itinerary, emergency procedures, and gear. We request that each student and parent carefully review the following recommended clothing list.

We use a layering system where different clothing items are worn separately or together to achieve optimum body temperature control.

Clothing

UPPER BODY GARMENTS

You will need at least three (3) insulating layers. These layers must fit comfortably over each other so they can all be worn together if necessary.

- Under Layer: long-sleeve t-shirts (1-2)
 Under Layer: short-sleeve t-shirts (2-3)
 Top Layer: EXPLORE360 fleece jacket (see enclosed order form)
 Rain Jacket: EXPLORE360 rain jacket (see enclosed order form)
 Sun Hat: a baseball cap works fine
 LOWER BODY GARMENTS
 Swimsuit: for canoeing on the Rio Grande
 Long Pants: jeans or any other type of pants cotton is ok (1-2 pair)
- □ **Underwear**: Enough for the week

□ Shorts: can be nylon or cotton (2-3)

Pack & Storage Bag

- □ **Duffel Bag**: 1 large enough to fit all items easily
- □ **Bus Bag**: 1 to keep items such as books, magazines, personal belongings, etc.

The activities in Big Bend will include transportation by bus to and from Big Bend National Park/State Park, transportation within Big Bend National Park/State Park, multiple hikes within both parks, and a day of canoeing on the Rio Grande under the supervision of Far Flung Outdoor Center.

 - A rain jacket or poncho
 - o A full water bottle
 - Sunscreen
- I understand we follow the Outdoor Ethics of "Leave No Trace."
