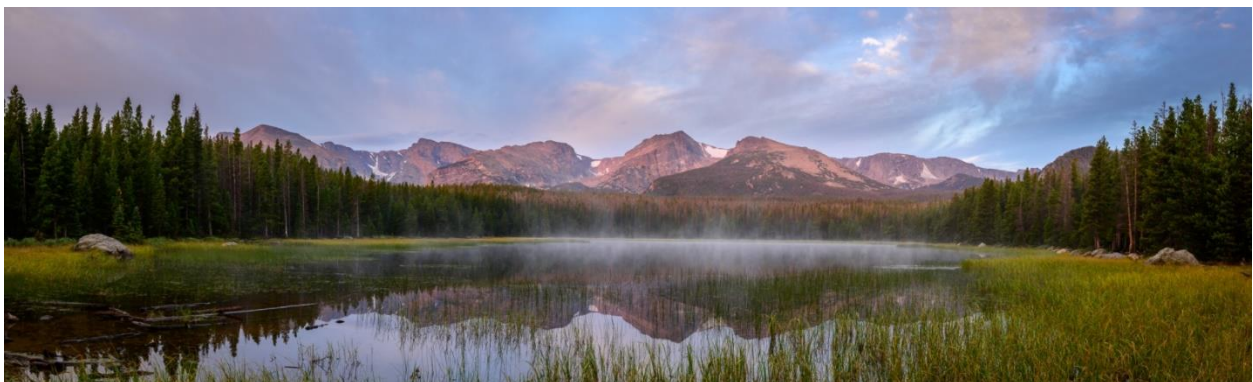
This trip includes:

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OUTDOOR EDUCATION PHILOSOPHY

Faith Family Academy is introducing a variety of outdoor programs for its students. The focus is to **teach safe and comfortable living in the wilderness** while learning an **appreciation of its beauty**, a **respect for the interrelationship of its parts**, and an **understanding of the need for continued protection and preservation of the wilderness environment**. Students will experience the out-of-doors with the attitude of **“learning by doing.”**

By participating, students broaden their personal awareness and experience through the process of adjusting to an unfamiliar outdoor setting. Students learn to separate their needs from wants and learn to live without the aid of modern America. Out of necessity, they evaluate their relations with others, discover the need for group support, and develop leadership capabilities --- often previously inexperienced.

The intent for this program is that students graduate from Faith Family Academy with the ability to travel through the back country with a measure of confidence, a minimum of environmental impact, a maximum of observational skills, and the wish to continue outdoor exploration. It is desired that students learn skills and discover their physical capabilities, make decisions and stretch their talents, but above all, experience the fun and joy of the outdoor world.

Outdoor Education Goals

1. To enable students to **know themselves** and their abilities.
2. To improve **thinking skills** through the necessity of solving problems with a real or imaginary physical impediment.
3. To develop and improve **leadership and communication skills** necessary to be successful in life.
4. To allow students the realization that they are capable of greater stamina, emotionally, physically, and mentally, than had previously been thought by placing them in a physically difficult, unfamiliar environment.
5. To develop in students a **love and respect for the natural world** so that, as adults, they may become discerning decision makers regarding environmental issues.
6. To enlist the active participation of each student by engaging his hands and his imagination in a **direct learning process**.
7. To provide an emotional, physical, and mental challenge and **lead students to growth**.
8. To correspond the Outdoor Education goals with those of the **science and history curricula** of the appropriate grade; to provide a better understanding of subject content and the opportunity to apply knowledge gained in the classroom.
9. To familiarize students with **outdoor living/travel procedures and safety**.

Purpose

1. To promote a feeling of unity and shared experience outside the classroom
2. To promote an understanding of various ecological habitats: Riparian, desert, high desert.
3. To encourage an appreciation for the beauty of the desert
4. To reinforce outdoor education skills
5. To give students the opportunity to journal in an outdoor setting.



EXPLORE360™ – SNOW MOUNTAIN RANCH TRIP ITINERARY

Trip Details

May 3, 2021 ALL PERMISSION AND MEDICAL HISTORY FORMS ARE DUE!

Day 1 Depart from the Oak Cliff campus for Colorado at **6:00 a.m.** by bus. We will be loading the bus at the school entrance behind McDonalds. We will make lunch and dinner stops along the way. Arrival at the Ranch should be around **9:00 p.m. mountain time.**

Day 2 Students will be divided into 4 groups. Each group will spend the next 4 days rotating through designated activities:

- **Learning about Mountain Formations**
- **Outdoor Living Skills**
- **Climbing Wall**
- **Team Building Activities**
- **A day of Rafting on the Colorado River**
- **A day hiking in Rocky Mountain National Park**

Day 3 Continue with rotations.

Day 4 Continue with rotations.

Day 5 Last day of activity rotations.

Day 6 Students will have a quick breakfast and board the bus for the trip back to Texas. We will make two stops for meals along the way and should arrive at the Oak Cliff campus at approximately **11:00 p.m.**

Weather Preparation

Average temperatures in late September in the mountains range from the high 60s to low 30s. While blue, sunny skies are the norm, afternoon rain showers or even snowstorms are possible. Students will need to be prepared for inclement weather.

EXPLORE360™ ADVENTURE LEARNING EQUIPMENT CHECKLIST

We cannot emphasize enough the importance of adequate clothing. Although we do not anticipate extreme temperatures, all students and adult leaders must be prepared for inclement weather. Cold temperatures, rain and wind does little harm to a group with a well-planned itinerary, emergency procedures, and gear. We request that each student and parent carefully review the following recommended clothing list.

We use a layering system where different clothing items are worn separately or together to achieve optimum body temperature control.

Clothing

UPPER BODY GARMENTS

You will need at least three (3) insulating layers. These layers must fit comfortably over each other so they can all be worn together if necessary.

- Under Layer:** long-sleeve t-shirts (1-2)
- Under Layer:** short-sleeve t-shirts (2-3)
- Top Layer:** EXPLORE360 fleece jacket (*see enclosed order form*)
- Rain Jacket:** EXPLORE360 rain jacket (*see enclosed order form*)
- Sun Hat:** a baseball cap works fine

LOWER BODY GARMENTS

- Swimsuit:** for river rafting
- Long Pants:** jeans or any other type of pants – cotton is ok (1-2 pair)
- Shorts:** can be nylon or cotton (2-3)
- Underwear:** Enough for the week

Pack & Storage Bag

- Duffel Bag:** 1 large enough to fit all items easily
- Bus Bag:** 1 to keep items such as books, magazines, personal belongings, etc.

Footwear

- Old pair of shoes:** These are for the raft trip and will get wet and muddy (1 pair)
- Camp Shoes:** Running, tennis, or athletic shoes to wear hiking (1 pair).
- Synthetic/Cotton Socks:** 5 pair

Miscellaneous Personal Gear

- Lip Balm**
- Sunscreen**
- Sunglasses**
- Flashlight or Head Lamp:** Should be durable and lightweight. Head lamps are preferred. Bring an extra set of batteries.
- Toiletries:** Toothbrush, toothpaste, small brush, skin lotion, shampoo, deodorant, etc.
- Towel**
- Pillow**
- Sleepwear**
- Money:** \$20-30 for souvenirs and snacks is adequate

I, _____, am aware in signing this document for my child's participation in the trip to Snow Mountain Ranch in Granby, Colorado with Faith Family Academy, that certain elements of the program are physically, mentally, socially, and emotionally demanding.

- Furthermore, I understand that certain risks and dangers (such as those listed below) exist in the activities in which my child will be participating. These risks include loss or damage to personal property, injury or fatality due to inclement weather, slipping, falling, insect bites, falling objects, immersion in cold water, hypothermia (cold exposure), hyperthermia (heat exposure), or suffering any type of accident or illness in remote areas without easy access to medical facilities, or while traveling to or from the activity sites.
- I acknowledge that while the program and its staff will make every reasonable effort to teach my child proper outdoor techniques and to minimize exposure to known risks, all dangers (hazards and perils) associated with these activities cannot be foreseen.
- My child has a personal duty and responsibility to learn and to follow the safety standards, guidelines, and procedures established by the staff and volunteers of Faith Family Academy and my child will make the staff and volunteers aware at any point during the activity in which my child questions his/her knowledge of these standards, guidelines, and procedures or his/her ability to participate.
- The activities in the trip to Colorado will include transportation by bus to and from Snow Mountain Ranch, transportation within Rocky Mountain National Park, transportation to/from river rafting outfitter, hikes within Rocky Mountain National Park, and a day of river rafting under the supervision of Adventures in Whitewater, located in Kremmling, Colorado.

I understand and assume ALL dangers (hazards and perils) and risks associated with this trip and waive all claims, demands, actions, causes of action, or suits arising from participation from the trip to Snow Mountain Ranch with Faith Family Academy, and do hereby release Faith Family Academy and its agents and representatives from liability whether caused by negligence, breach of contract, strict liability, or otherwise, which I may ever have against the school, their successors and assigns, employees, volunteers, agents, and their heirs, successors, executors, and assigns. Furthermore, I give my consent to the leaders or other medical personnel to treat my child in an emergency, including blood transfusion, epinephrine (adrenaline) for anaphylactic shock, ibuprofen, and emergency medical transportation. My signature on this document is also intended to bind my successors, heirs, representatives, administrators and assigns.

- I understand that backpacks should always be packed with the following:
 - A warm jacket
 - A rain jacket
 - A full water bottle
 - Sunscreen

- I understand we follow the Outdoor Ethics of “Leave No Trace.”
